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Criterion includes generalized joint hypermobility, to be assessed by the Beighton score with ≥ 6 out of 9 for children and adolescents, out of 9 for adults up to 70 years of age and out of 10 for adults over 70 years of age. The Ehlers-Danlos Society has been supporting work on updating the diagnostic criteria for hypermobile Ehlers-Danlos syndrome (hEDS), improving the definitions of hypermobility spectrum disorders (HSD), and evidence-based diagnostic pathways. The work on the criteria is being done by the hEDS/HSD and Pediatric Working Groups of The International Consortium. The clinical diagnosis of hEDS can be established in an adult proband (an individual who has reached biologic maturity) with all three of the following criteria: Generalized joint hypermobility with a Beighton score of ≥ 6 (Table 2) must all be met for a clinical diagnosis of hEDS.
